The Society of Japanese Aerospace Companies (SJAC) was founded in 1952, at the reopening year of Japanese aviation industry. SJAC has contributed to growth of our aerospace industry through its various activities, as listed below. SJAC is comprised of approximately 140 member companies. These members represent a majority of the firms engaged in the manufacturing, repairing and trading of aircraft, launch vehicle, satellite and related equipment in Japan.

## 1 Industrial Policies Promotion

- Participation and support in reviewing Japanese aerospace administration.
- Negotiation with relevant government ministries and departments with respect to budget and system reviews for Japanese aerospace industry.

## 2 Industrial Foundation Buildup and Maintenance

- Wide range of survey, research and development activities.

- Search of trends in aerospace technology.
- Research and development of future aerospace technologies.
- Review of technical standards (i.e., JIS, ISO, etc.).
- Management of EDI (Electric Data Interchange) centers.

## 3 Cooperation with Overseas Aerospace Industries

SJAC, participating in such international exhibitions that take place in Paris and Farnborough, holds meetings for interaction with the U.S., EU and other foreign industries association, thus promoting international cooperation in the aerospace industry.

## 4 Japan International Aerospace Exhibition

SJAC holds an international exhibition with the participation of the world's major aerospace companies and authorities. This is the largest aerospace exhibition in Japan which contributes to promoting business and to getting to know the capability of industries in Japan. SJAC plans to hold the next exhibition, "Japan International Aerospace Exhibition 2024 (JA2024)" in autumn of 2024.

From the 1st (1966) to 7th (1993), the Air Self-Defense Force base was used as the venue, but since the 8th, it has been changed to a trade-centered exhibition using a permanent exhibition hall. In order to promote trade-focused exhibitions, BCI Aerospace's B to B meeting system had been introduced in 2012 to promote business matching. Since 2016, the venue has been moved to the Tokyo area (Tokyo Big Sight) to promote trade-focused exhibitions.
